NCCI Audit Non-Compliance Charges: A Reminder

On behalf of the entire team at Alliance Insurance Group, we wanted to remind employers about the Audit Non-Compliance Charge.

Effective 1/1/2017, the National Council on Compensation Insurance (NCCI) approved a Workers' Compensation policy endorsement that allows the insurance company to charge up to 2x the originally estimated premium when a policy holder is in non-compliance with an audit request. All states except Hawaii have adopted the Audit Non-Compliance Charge.

In addition, failure to cooperate with the audit may result in a cancellation of Workers' Compensation coverage. Audit non-compliance will disqualify an employer from obtaining coverage from any insurance company until the outstanding audit is completed.
